

HBPA Minutes

May 13, 2008

The monthly meeting of the HBPA was called to order by Bo Bailey, President, at 6:35 PM.

Ellen Arnold gave an update on the band banquet. Students are to park in the HS/MS cafeteria parking lot. There will be 2 limos to shuttle the students and their dates to the elementary cafeteria. Ron Wilson will take their pictures as they exit the limo. All seems to be going OK. Decorating will be done Thursday afternoon/night, and Friday afternoon.

Minutes from the April meeting were sent out by email and posted on the band's website. Ron Wilson made a motion to approve the minutes. Nancy Wagenfuehr seconded. Motion was passed.

Sue Morris presented the Treasurer's report. There is a balance of \$7,248.65. The bank is charging a fee for returned checks. She is contacting them to see if they will reverse the charge since they've not charged us in the past.

Mrs. Hadderton and Mr. Alsup reported that Holliday was the only school to take two bands to UIL concert/sight-reading contest to receive top scores. Both Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band won Sweepstakes due to UIL Marching Contest and C/SR.

The concert went well Monday (5/12) night and was well-attended. The 5th grade band will perform two concerts. The first will be in the Activity Room in the elementary school for K-2nd at 8:30 AM on Wednesday, May 28. They will perform again at 1 PM, on the same day, in conjunction with the elementary awards assembly.

The State Solo/Ensemble contest is May 23 and 24 in San Marcos. Kids will get meal money.

5th grade band students go to The Plex on Thursday, May 15. The 6th and 7th grade bands will travel to Six Flags on Tuesday, May 20.

Junior Drum Major tryouts are after school on Wednesday, May 14. Officer elections will take place on Thursday, May 15.

This year's band video will be available for purchase at the banquet. Sherri Lewis made a motion to set the price of the video at \$10. Stacia Boyd gave the second and the motion passed.

HBPA Officer Elections 2008-2009. The new slate of officers was approved. No vote was needed since there were no contested offices.

Mrs. Hadderton requested that the HBPA present an honorarium to Mr. Enloe for all of his hard work with the kids during concert season. Stacia Boyd made a motion to present \$100 to Mr. Enloe. Sherri Lewis seconded, and the motion passed.

Sherri Lewis made a motion to present each of the 4 primary "band" bus drivers with a \$50 Visa Check Card. Nancy Wagenfuehr gave the second and the motion passed.

Jamie Wilson will create certificates to be presented along with the honorarium and check cards.

It was requested to move the monthly meetings of the HBPA from the second Tuesday of the month to the third Monday. Jimmy McCoy, incoming president, is on the water board, and their meetings are on the second Tuesday. Mrs. Clark made a motion to move the meeting day, Angie Anderson seconded, and the motion passed. This will begin in June, where the meeting will be held on Monday, June 16.

Fundraisers: There will be a table set up at the banquet for purchases of the band video and the band cookbook.

The candle sale did not go as well as we had hoped for. It was done during TAKS time. Plus, we had to pay shipping and taxes, because this is a company that is based in Texas. We did have a profit of \$457.

The annual Lakeside City Garage Sale is Saturday, May 17th. Sherri and Nancy will set up in front of Nancy's house and will sell baked goods and cookbooks.

Sherri would like to change from using the large Styrofoam cups to the actual cone cups for the snowcones next year. This will be cheaper since we won't have to use as much ice and syrup. Plus, the cones are much cheaper than the Styrofoam. Nancy Wagenfuehr made the motion to switch, Angie Anderson seconded and the motion passed.

We will try to set up a car wash during the summer. Possible date is Saturday, June 21. Sherri will get with Auto Zone to see if it is possible. Emails and phone calls will be made to the parents and kids when the date is set.

Drum Major Camp will cost \$650. Nancy Wagenfuehr made a motion that the HBPA provide funding for both drum majors to attend the camp. Sherri Lewis seconded and the motion passed.

There will be a 7th grade "meet and greet" on Monday, May 19 at 7PM in the band hall. We will serve simple finger foods and water. Mrs. Hadderton will talk to her mom about baking a cake. This meeting is so that parents of next year's 8th grade band students can meet with HBPA members, ask questions, etc. Summer Showcase is so hectic—this might be a way to ease them into the marching band program.

Bo Bailey adjourned the meeting at 7:15 PM.
